WHEREAS, the Inter-Tribal Council of the Five Civilized Tribes (ITC) is an organization that unites the tribal governments of the Cherokee, Chickasaw, Choctaw, Muscogee (Creek) and Seminole Nation, representing approximately 815,000 Indian people throughout the United States; and

WHEREAS, the Five Tribes have consistently demonstrated a commitment to respectful, mutually beneficial cooperation with local, state, and federal governments in service of shared goals such as public safety, economic development, infrastructure investment, and community well-being; and

WHEREAS, agreements between Tribal Nations and local governments, such as the recently entered into settlement agreement between the Muscogee (Creek) Nation and the City of Tulsa, reflect meaningful collaboration, intergovernmental trust, and effective governance; and

WHEREAS, the Muscogee (Creek) Nation and the City of Tulsa have entered into an agreement to coordinate the handling of criminal matters involving Native Americans within the City of Tulsa, reflecting a cooperative approach to law enforcement and public safety; and

WHEREAS, the Inter-Tribal Council recognizes these intergovernmental partnerships as critical to the continued prosperity and security of all Oklahomans, Native and non-Native alike; and

WHEREAS, public statements by Oklahoma Governor Kevin Stitt have repeatedly sought to undermine the sovereignty of Tribal Nations, cast doubt on lawful agreements, and inflame division between governments, in direct contradiction to the spirit of cooperation that defines our tribal and civic relationships; and

WHEREAS, these statements erode public confidence in government, weakens cooperative efforts that benefit the citizens of Oklahoma, and dishonors the legal and moral obligations the State of Oklahoma holds to Tribal Nations; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Inter-Tribal Council of the Five Civilized Tribes affirms its continued support for productive intergovernmental



cooperation between Tribal Nations and local governments, grounded in mutual respect, shared responsibility, and good-faith partnership; and





The Chickasaw Nation




